Part 2 Championship Information

2.1 Dates

The U13 T4 BC Hockey Championship will be held from Sunday, March 17 to Thursday, March 21.

2.2 Banquet

The banquet for all players, coaches, managers and game officials involved in this year's U13 T4 BC Hockey Championship will be held on Saturday, March 16th at the Community Center, 600 Campbell Ave, Revelstoke. Banquet festivities will begin at 5:00pm. Attendance is mandatory for all players, coaches and managers. The recommended dress code is smart casual.

2.3 Coaches/Managers Meeting

The coaches and managers meeting will commence immediately following the banquet, at approximately 7:30 pm, in the MacPherson meeting room at the Community Center, next to the banquet dinner. This meeting is mandatory.

2.4 Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The Opening Ceremonies will take place from on Sunday March 17th at the Revelstoke Forum at 5:45 pm. Attendance by all teams is mandatory. Please ensure your players/coaches arrive on time to get organized prior to the ceremony. Players should wear their game jerseys. The 2 teams playing immediately after the opening ceremonies must be fully dressed and ready to play as soon as the Opening Ceremonies are finished.

Bronze, Silver and Gold medals will be awarded following the Finals on Wednesday, March 20th. A Fair Play Trophy will also be presented to the team with the least amount of penalty minutes and the best overall display of sportsmanship throughout the event. Attendance by teams not playing in the final is optional. If the Team that won the Fair Play Award has already left, the award will be mailed to their Association.

2.5 Arena

All games will be played at the Revelstoke Forum which is located at 1100 Vernon Avenue. The Forum will be the central hub for this year's U13 T4 BC Hockey Championships Tournament.



2.6 Goaltender relief

The host will NOT be providing goaltender relief for participating teams; teams are expected to plan accordingly.

4.4 Sports Stores (skate sharpening and hockey supplies)

Skate sharpening is located within the arena, go see a rink attendant.

Revelstoke currently does not have a sports store specializing in hockey equipment. We encourage everyone to ensure they have everything they need before arriving in Revelstoke. The nearest hockey shops are in Salmon Arm and Vernon, 1.25 and 2 hours away respectively.

4.5 Recreation

Revelstoke Aquatic Centre: 25-metre pool offering lane swimming, a leisure pool with a lazy river, wild waterslide, hot tub, a sauna, and steam room.

Hot Springs: Enjoy the soothing mineral waters of the hot springs near Revelstoke, all in pristine mountain and wilderness settings.

- **Crazy Creek Resort**, surrounded by natural beauty, four modern contoured hot pools totaling over 2,000 sq ft. The water at Crazy Creek Hot Pools is drawn from a well with the source coming from the base of Eagle Pass Mountain then geothermally heated and conditioned. The beautiful glacial blue water is pristine and clear. It is sulfur-free and contains the usual minerals. 6162 TransCanada Highway, Malakwa, BC. 250.836.4097. - **Halcyon Hot Springs**, situated in a spectacular waterfront location on beautiful Upper Arrow Lake, with views of the soaring Monashee Mountains. Hot or warm pools, cold plunge. Located 68 km South of Revelstoke along Highway 23, be advised a ferry ride is needed, and the ferry runs every hour, on the hour to cross from this side (Shelter Bay) and on the half hour to come back (GalenaBay). 4.6 Movie Theatres and Museums

Movies:

Take in a Movie at our local vintage theatre, The Roxy, 115 Mackenzie Avenue.

A near-disastrous fire had destroyed the building of the local Provincial Theatre, miraculously sparing its expensive projection equipment. With the equipment intact, but no movie house in which to use it, plans went ahead to convert the Lawrence Hardware building into Revelstoke's newest cinema. Amid a last-minute, round-the-clock flurry installing seats procured from England, which had traveled by ship through the Panama Canal, the new theatre opened on December 22, 1938.

A contest to decide the theatre's name was held in February 1939. The name Avolie was chosen from more than 150 submissions. It may or may not be a coincidence that the winning submission was inspired by the name of the theatre manager's wife, Olive.

Many years of movie-going bliss passed in Revelstoke. In 1959, under new ownership, the theatre's name changed once more. It became The Roxy.

Revelstoke is located right on the Trans-Canada Highway (Hwy #1). Getting to Revelstoke from the east, features views of pristine forests, dramatic peaks, and impressive glaciers. Getting to Revelstoke from the west, takes you through the scenic Okanagan Valley. If you are renting a vehicle and traveling during our snowy winter months, allow extra travel time for the weather.
