Closing Ceremonies will be held following the final championship game. All teams are encouraged to attend the closing ceremonies, but it's not mandatory.



ATTENDING TEAM REQUIREMENTS

Once your team has earned their spot in the Championships, we will require the following information.

- Official Team Picture. Ensure the quality of the picture is good as we will be using it in our program and all other championship print material. Please list the names of everyone in order as they appear in the team picture.
- **Association Logo** Please send an image of your association logo and your home and away iersey colors.
- **Contact Information** Please provide Head Coach and Manager names, home/cell numbers, and email addresses.
- Equipment Checks. Equipment checks will be done prior to the first game. Each team is required to go over their equipment prior to coming. Players with illegal/worn equipment will not be able to participate using the illegal equipment. Bring extra helmet screws, gloves and tape. Ensure your local Risk Management Coordinator or District Director does an equipment check with your team before coming to the championships to avoid any disappointments. Most frequent illegal equipment findings: glove palms, helmet fit and J hooks, stick plugs and neck guards with BNQ certification not clearly visible. Goalie helmets must have chin cups and side straps.
- **Team Baskets** Each team will be responsible for bringing a basket from their area with a value of \$250-\$300. Baskets can be brought to Coaches meeting. NO ALCOHOL please

A complete registration package with detailed instructions will be sent to the team manager once you have qualified.

ABOUT FORT ST JOHN

Our History

Over the years the community has been moved a number of times for varying economic reasons. The present location is thought to be its sixth. The original trading post built in the area was named Rocky Mountain House (not to be confused with the modern Alberta town by that name). It was established one year after Sir Alexander Mackenzie explored the area in 1793. One of a series of forts along the Peace River constructed to service the fur trade, it was located southwest of the present site of Fort St. John. The Dunneza and Sikanni First Nations used it as a trading post. It was also used as a supply depot for further expeditions into the territory. The fort closed in 1805. Fort d'Epinette was built in 1806 by the North West Company. It was renamed Fort St. John in 1821 following the purchase of the North West Company by the Hudson's Bay Company. This fort was located about 500 metres downstream from the mouth of the Beatton River, which at that time was known as the Pine River (d'epinette in French). It was shut down in 1823. The site was designated a National Historic Site of Canada in 1958.[3][4]

After a lapse of nearly forty years, Fort St. John was reopened in 1860 on the south side of the Peace River, directly south of the present community. It was moved in 1872 by Francis Work Beatton directly across the river. This community lasted until 1925 when the river ceased to be the main avenue of transportation and the fort was moved closer to where settlers were establishing homesteads. The new town was constructed at Fish Creek, northwest of the present community, on the new trail to Fort Nelson. It did not shut down until 1975. In 1928, C. M. Finch moved his general store to two quarters of land where he also built a government building to house the land, telegraph and post offices. The present site for the town was firmly established after he donated five acres (20,000 m²) for a Roman Catholic Church and additional land for a hospital.















Today

The **City of Fort St. John** is a city in northeastern <u>British Columbia</u>, Canada. A member municipality of the <u>Peace River Regional District</u>, the city encompasses a total area of about 22 square kilometres (8.5 sq mi) with 20,155 residents at the <u>2016 census[2]</u> Located at Mile 47, it is one of the largest cities along the <u>Alaska Highway</u>. Originally established in 1794, as a <u>trading post</u>, Fort St. John is the oldest European-established settlement in present-day British Columbia. Fort St. John is served by the <u>Fort St. John Airport</u>. The municipal slogan is *Fort St. John: The Energetic City*.

TRANSPORTATION

Airport

The North Peace Regional Airport is proud to be a part the a busy, energetic and growing region! We provide service to a thriving oil & gas industry as well as British Columbia's largest agricultural area. We are located at Mile 45 on the World Famous Alaska Highway between the town of Taylor and the City of Fort St. John. We are your convenient easy to use Peace Region Hub linking up the business and commerce communities of our region.

You can access the airport from the Alaska Highway at Baldonnel Road, Swanson Lumber Road, East By Pass Road or by travelling east on 100 Avenue. The North Peace Regional Airport, is 7 kilometres east of Fort St. John.

Air Canada Jazz and WestJet Encore carry over 250,000 passengers per year through Fort St. John Airport. These airlines offer daily flights to Vancouver, Edmonton, and Calgary.

Fort St. John Airport is a fully accessible facility with one terminal and two runways. Air Canada Jazz provides an access ramp for all flights. Spicy Fusion restaurant serves Indian cuisine. A visitor information kiosk has details of Fort St. John's amenities, accommodations, arts, culture, and festivals.

Highways

The North Peace is well connected! Highway 97 runs along the Peace River, connecting the North Peace Region to Highway 16 and the Northern Corridor.

Highway 97 North, also known as the Alaska Highway, provides a vital link for communities and resources throughout central and northern B.C. as well as connections to US Route 97, Highway 16, Highway 49 and 2, and the Yukon Highway 1.

Fort St. John is:

1212 kilometres northeast of Vancouver.

654 kilometres northwest of Edmonton,

930 kilometres northwest of Calgary Alberta.

Highway 97 South goes to Dawson Creek (John Hart Highway) travels west to Chetwynd and then south to Prince George. **Highway 97 North** (Alaska Highway) goes north to Fort Nelson, and Watson Lake. **Highway 2** travels southeast to the Alberta border where it connects to Highway 43 to Grande Prairie, AB.

SIGHTS TO SEE

Charlie Lake Monument, Lakeshore Dr

Charlie Lake

In May of 1942, as part of the construction of the now world-famous Alaska Highway, a US Corp of Engineers Pontoon Barge carrying seventeen soldiers and equipment across Charlie Lake sank, taking the lives of twelve soldiers. In 2008, a monument was erected in memory of the soldiers that lost their lives that day. You can learn more about their stories and visit the monument at the Rotary Boat Launch at Mile 52 of the Alaska Highway.

Peace Viewpoint

Fort St. John

Learn more about Fort St. John's roots by visiting the Peace River Lookout Point located at the south end of 100th Street. This lookout provides wonderful views of the Peace River. There are two interpretive signs placed there by the Fort St. John North Peace Museum and Peace River Regional District. The first sign explores the history of the Peace River as the highway of the north from canoes and scows to steamboats and sternwheelers. Learn about the D.A. Thomas – the largest, most luxurious, and best-known steamer on the Peace. The second sign examines five historic landmarks that could once be seen from this lookout. These sites include the British Columbia Police Barracks and Jail, the Pacific Great Eastern Railway Bridge, the North West Mounted Police Trail, Fort St. John (1858-1872), and Old Fort St. John (1873-1923). Pack your camera and a lunch or snack and enjoy the beauty and history of the Peace River.

Site C Viewpoint Road, Charlie Lake, Peace River C, Peace River, British Columbia V0C 1H0

The Site C viewpoint is now open on the north bank of the Peace River above the dam site. This viewpoint gives visitors an opportunity to watch Site C construction activities from a safe distance. The viewpoint is located immediately west of the City of Fort St. John, on the south side of Highway 97. Visitors can access the viewpoint by driving south on 269 Road, past the Peace River Regional District landfill. Approximately 500 metres south of the landfill, turn right to access the viewpoint. The turnoff will be marked with a large sign.

Come explore a tepee, trapper's cabin, blacksmith's shop, 1921 school room, 1930s dentist office, missionary chapel, 1930 Outpost Hospital room, Finch's General Store, British Columbia Police Barracks, furnished rooms of a pioneer home, post office, newspaper office, Alaska Highway exhibit, photographs, artefacts, and more!

The Fort St. John North Peace Museum and North Peace Historical Society are dedicated to the collection, preservation, storage and display of items relating to the history of the North Peace River area for the education and enjoyment of present and future generations. The museum is very pleased to host tours when contacted in advance.
