

## General Information

### SPECTATOR ENTRANCE FEES

***In lieu of spectator gate fees,*** we will be collecting non-perishable food items and monetary donations to support our local food bank. Any contributions you can make will gratefully accepted and will be hugely beneficial to our community.

### 50/50 & RAFFLE TABLE

We will be offering a running total, 50/50 draw each day. 50% of the sales from each day will go to the winner, with the draw taken during the 2<sup>st</sup> intermission of the final game every evening.

Along with a few pieces of apparel, we will be hosting a raffle table with baskets provided by each team. These baskets are always full of goodies and offer a range of themes, so be sure to come by and pop your name into the draw boxes for your favourites.

Cash, credit and debit will be accepted!

### PRACTICE ICE

A small amount of practice ice will be available on March 17 and 18. Please reach out to Bobbi or Tracey for availability and rental rates.





### EQUIPMENT CHECKS

It is each team's responsibility to ensure that all player equipment is legal and meets standards. [BC Hockey's Equipment Checklist](#) is an excellent resource. Team officials will be asked to certify that they have checked the gear for their players during the Coaches Meeting. Please bring along a signed [Equipment Compliance](#) form to confirm that you have qualified your gear.

### PLAYER ENTRANCE

We ask that all players enter the dressing room tunnel via the rear entrance of the arena where there is a turnaround for drops offs available. (See map above). Players that attempt to come through the main lobby will be turned around.

### TEAM HOSTS

South Delta hosts will be assigned to each team. These locals will welcome you to our community and will be available throughout the tournament to assist you with navigating South Delta and support coaches and players where needed.

### LOCKER ROOM ASSIGNMENTS

Room assignments will be posted at the beginning of each day in the lower lobby of the arena. *Please bring your own lock for the dressing rooms – no locks will be provided.*

### WARM UP PUCKS

Pucks will be provided at each bench for warmups. Please ensure ALL pucks are returned to the crates following your skate - the crates will not be refilled.





## Team Requirements

Once your team has earned its spot in the Championships, we will require the following information

- Official Team Picture: Highest resolution jpeg will be required for use in digital material. Please include the names of everyone in order as they appear in the team photo.
- Association Logo: Please send an EPS or illustrator image of your association logo and your home jersey colors.
- Contact information: Please provide the team Head Coach and Managers' names, emails & contact numbers
- Sponsor Acknowledgements: All teams will be allowed to acknowledge their team logo on their team page in the digital Championship media pages.
- Each team is asked to provide a raffle basket of up to \$200 in value, on day 1 of the tournament (no alcohol, please). Please forward your theme and a list of basket contents to the organizers so that we can ensure that there are no duplicates.
- Please inform us of any female players so that we can plan an alternative dressing room.
- An official roster as a headcount for the banquet and any swag/snacks we provide.

## Banquet Information

A banquet for players and team staff will be held at the [Harris Barn](#) at Hawthorn Grove Park on Saturday, March 18 from 6pm-8pm (doors at 5:40). Please forward any dietary restrictions prior ASAP upon securing your place in the tournament; last minute requests may not be possible. This event will be casual and should be a great time! We have planned for 25 seats and can be flexible, so a headcount would be appreciated so we can plan appropriately. **If you plan to arrive at the banquet by bus, please reach out for instructions as busses are not able to cross the bridge.**





## Coaches and Managers Meeting

There will be a MANDATORY meeting for all coaches and managers immediately after the banquet upstairs in the BLUE ROOM at the Ladner Leisure Centre, starting at 8:30pm. This meeting will last approximately 40 mins and will include:

- Dressing room assignments
- Skate sharpening & sports store information
- Medical facilities in and around the arena
- Opening and closing ceremonies
- And collection any required documents/items (as found in the [Team Requirements](#), and as communicated otherwise)

## Opening Ceremonies

Opening Ceremonies will take place on Sunday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023 @7:00 pm at Ladner Leisure Center, and team attendance is mandatory. Teams that are not playing in the game immediately after the ceremonies should wear a jersey (your choice of home or away) for the event. The two teams participating in the game immediately following the ceremonies will be in full gear ready to play.

Please assemble as a team in the upper lobby area above ice level and be ready to go by 6:45pm.

\*\*If you have a wee kid sized jersey to match your team, please bring it! We will have U6-8 players helping teams to their spots for the opening and they'd love to represent your squad\*\*





## Getting to South Delta

### BY CAR

- From the north: (Richmond and Vancouver) take Hwy 99 south through the George Massey Tunnel or Hwy 91 across the Alex Fraser Bridge.
- From the south: (Surrey, White Rock, or the U.S. Border Crossings at Peace Arch/Blaine or the Pacific Highway) follow Hwy 99 north and take the Hwy 91, Hwy 17 or Hwy 17A exits.
- From the west: (Vancouver Island and the Southern Gulf Islands) via BC Ferries' Tsawwassen Terminal follow Hwy 17A.
- From the east: (Surrey and New Westminister) follow Hwy 10 west or Hwy 17 south.
