## OPENING CEREMONY



## IMPORTANT INFORMATION


- The registration desk will open each day, one hour before the first scheduled game in the lobby of the Memorial Arena.

## WHERE IS CRANBROOK?

**FROM VANCOUVER:** Travel along Highway 1 (Trans-Canada) to the highway junction in the community of Hope, BC. At the highway junction there are three highway routes leading into the interior of BC. Highway 3 (Crowsnest) is the quickest route traveling east from Hope on Highway 3 to Cranbrook.

**FROM CALGARY:** Travel Highway 1 (Trans-Canada) west to Banff National Park and then continue to the provincial border of British Columbia. Continue driving west on Hwy #1 to the community of Golden, BC. From Golden, travel Highway 93/95 south to Cranbrook, BC. Or travel south on Highway 2 and then west on Highway 3 (Crowsnest). Or travel south on Highway 2 to Nanton, AB. From Nanton, travel west on Highway 533 until you reach Highway 22 (Cowboy Trail). Follow Highway 22 south to where it meets Highway 3, following Highway 3 to Cranbrook.







## COMMUNITY INFORMATION

### KTUNAXA NATION

Ktunaxa (pronounced 'k-too-nah-ha') people have occupied the lands adjacent to the Kootenay and Columbia Rivers and the Arrow Lakes of British Columbia, Canada for more than 10,000 years. The Traditional Territory of the Ktunaxa Nation covers approximately 70,000 square kilometres within the Kootenay region of south-eastern British Columbia and historically included parts of Alberta, Montana, Washington and Idaho.

For thousands of years, the Ktunaxa people enjoyed the natural bounty of the land, seasonally migrating throughout the Traditional Territory to follow vegetation and hunting cycles. They obtained all their food, medicine and materials for shelter and clothing from nature – hunting, fishing and gathering throughout the Territory, across the Rocky Mountains and on the Great Plains of both Canada and the United States. European settlement in the late 1800s, followed by the establishment of Indian Reserves led to the creation of the present Indian Bands. Ktunaxa citizenship consists of Nation members from six Bands located throughout historic traditional Ktunaxa territory. Five of those Bands are located in British Columbia, Canada.

### ʔaq'am

ʔaq'am is a member community of the Ktunaxa Nation. As a community, they share many values – recognizing the importance of family, unity and co-operation, effective communication, love and kindness, respect, safety and security, inclusion, education and learning, healthy and balanced living – and take pride in their heritage, language and culture. We value natural law and practice stewardship of the land, water, animals, and plants. The vision of the Ktunaxa ancestors continues to guide them through traditions, customs, language, and beliefs. They strive to govern effectively and maximize their lands and resources for the benefit of all living things and future generations, in accordance with their values and principles. They recognize Ktunaxa rights and title. The Band Council consists of a Chief and four counsellors, all elected through the Band's own election process. ʔaq'am members are employed in a variety of fields, including local government, hospitality, construction, transportation, tourism, forestry, and entrepreneurial pursuits. The ʔaq'am administration operates a diverse range of programs and services, including the ʔaq'amnik' Elementary school, ʔaq'amnik' Daycare, ʔaq'amnik' After School and Summer Programs, Community Education Services, Community Health, Economic Development, Lands/Natural Resources and Housing and Administrative Services. These functions are operated centrally at the Band's Administration Building. The ʔaq'am Community has the largest population of all Ktunaxa Nation Bands and the largest land base, occupying



18,420 acres. ʔaᑭ'am members work together to foster a vibrant, healthy community in which everyone has a role to play.

## ROCKY MOUNTAIN METIS ASSOCIATION

The Rocky Mountain Métis Association is the local Métis chartered association in Cranbrook, Kimberley and Creston. The RMMA represents the Métis people, culture, traditions, and cultural belongings. The Métis Nation emerged from within the Métis Nation Homeland during the seventeenth century as a result of the French and English fur trade. At that time, Canada did not exist as a country, and the provincial governments we know today in western Canada would not exist for another 200 years. Marriages between European fur traders and First Nation women produced children of mixed ancestry, who eventually became known as Métis, or Country Born people. Establishing relationships with Aboriginal women gave fur traders valuable contacts with tribal communities, and tribal communities regular access to trade goods. The women were also able to teach the traders local languages, show them how to survive on the land and tend to domestic affairs such as preparing food, constructing shelters, and making clothing. Daughters born from these unions usually carried on traditional roles taught by their mothers. Sons grew up to enter the fur trade, become hunters, trappers, or canoe men. Those with schooling were able to become clerks or interpreters at the trading posts. The development of a unique Métis culture began to unfold.
