EQUIPMENT CHECKS

Equipment checks will be done prior to the first game. Each team is required to go over their equipment prior to coming. Players with illegal/worn equipment will not be able to participate using the illegal equipment. Bring extra helmet screws, gloves and tape. Ensure your local Risk Management Coordinator or District Director does an equipment check with your team before coming to the championships to avoid any disappointments. Most frequent illegal equipment findings: glove palms, helmet fit and J hooks, stick plugs and neck guards with BNQ certification not clearly visible. Goalie helmets must have chin cups and side straps.

EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST

EQUIPMENT	INSPECT	BASIC THINGS TO LOOK FOR
PANTS	Condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No tears, loose threads &/or dangling belts/straps.- Inside zippers done up and working.
STICK		<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Plug is in butt end of the stick (top).- Blade has no sharp edges, breakages
HELMET	Condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Must have visible CSA label, snug chin strap, ear guards, be tape free & not painted.- Numbers, team decals and decals supporting a cause (ie. Humbolt, Cancer etc.) are permitted- No cracks in shell or padding.
FACEMASK	Condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No metal bars broken on cages- Tight screws and if replacements, NOT too long.- Straps snug with stretch in elastic- Clips in place.- NO cracks in plastic- watch for rust at wire seams
GLOVES	Condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- High enough so covers wrist. Firm fingers, thumb and back padding- Palms soft and pliable. NO holes near fingers or in palm larger than a quarter)- No loose threads
NECKGUARD	Condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Fits snug enough around neck- MUST have BNQ certification, be free of fabric cuts- Velcro strap NOT worn and in good working order- Must not be altered in any way- Rips or tears should be sewn.- No tape wrapped around neckguard

OUR FIRST NATIONS HISTORY

It is understood that Syilx Okanagan People have come from the land and animals themselves. Before humans were created, animal people lived on the land and gave up themselves along with their ways, beliefs, practices, and experiences for the people-to-be. Many of the teachings we have today come from the animal and plant people are portrayed through *captikʷł*, oral narrative. These *captikʷł* help to bring forward many important Syilx values, teachings, and worldviews. The *captikʷł* help to carry Syilx Okanagan natural law. These laws can be understood from the stages of Syilx Okanagan People.

1. *stəlsqílxʷ* (torn from the earth) - life form of first people without natural instincts to survive.
2. *xatma? sqílxʷ* (in front of us *sqílxʷ*) - first thinking people who learned the natural law to survive.
3. *sqílxʷ* (dreaming ones, bound together, of the land) - original people who learned to live together on the land in peace.
4. *?awtma?sqílxʷ* (to struggle and/or come after *sqílxʷ*) - today's *sqílxʷ* after the arrival of new comers.

These stages bring light to the worldview of the Syilx Okanagan People.

Located at the head of Okanagan Lake is the Okanagan Indian Band main reserve. The Okanagan Indian Band comprises six reserves located in the North Okanagan totalling 10,636 ha of reserve land. These reserves are Okanagan, Otter Lake, Harris, Swan Lake, Priest Valley, and Duck Lake. Members of the Okanagan Indian Band live in various historical villages up along Okanagan Lake, Round Lake, Swan Lake, Duck Lake, Wood Lake, and Kalamalka Lake. These historical settlements are still highly valued and are occupied by current generations.





OUR COMMUNITY

While the main reserve is often associated with nqmaplqs, many of the tributaries and sites of significance along the lake hold place names each associated with ancestral and contemporary use such as Komasket Park. Each place name holds the significance of the area often associated with activities, specific species, land forms, or seasonal settlements. While the Okanagan Indian Band is located in the North Okanagan valley, the territory of the Syilx Okanagan People extends beyond the reserve boundaries.

The binding that brings together Syilx Okanagan People is the language itself. Nsyilxcn or nqilxʷcn is a part of the larger Salishan family group. Nsyilxcn is the language of the Syilx People and nqilxʷcn is Indigenous language. Nsyilxcn is one of 23 Salishan languages. Salishan languages have been spoken in North America for thousands of years and are still spoken to this day in Southern British Columbia, Washington State, Idaho, Montana and Oregon. Nsyilxcn is spoken by the Okanagan in British Columbia and by the Southern Okanagan, Sinixt, Methow, and Sanpoil tribes in Washington State.

Kal Tire Place - North facility has a regulation-size 200' x 85' sheet of ice, seating for 400 spectators. In addition, the facility features two lease spaces for dryland training facilities, multi-purpose room, and additional office space.

Kal Tire Place has parking lots in two locations, both situated within eye's view of entrances to the building. The lots hold a total of 680 vehicles. Designated disabled parking is available in the upper parking lot.

The facility is also home to the Greater Vernon Minor Hockey Association office.



PAT DUKE MEMORIAL ARENA

2270 Shields Avenue, Lumby, BC V0E 2G0

The Pat Duke Memorial Arena was built in 1967 as a Centennial project and is a single ice sheet (80' x 185') with four renovated change rooms. The arena is the home of Lumby & District Minor Hockey Association, Lumby & District Figure Skating Association, men's and women's hockey, and public skating.



The arena was recently renovated and expanded, which was made possible through a 2016 Kraft Hockeyville win, a TELUS community grant, and a \$2.59 million contribution from the federal Gas Tax Fund.






