EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

We will provide **TEAM PUCKS** for warm-up ice.

PANTS – no tears, loose threads and/or dangling belts or straps. Inside zippers are fastened.

STICKS – the plug must be in the butt end of the stick (Top). The blade must have no sharp edges or breakages.

HELMET – must have visible csa label, snug chin strap, ear guards. Must be decal/tape free and unpainted. No cracks in the shell or padding.

FACEMASK – no broken bars or rust on metal cage. Screws must be tight, and if replacements, must not be too long. Straps must be snug with stretch in elastic. Clips must be in place. No cracks in plastic components.

GLOVES – must be high enough to cover the wrist with firm finger, thumb and back padding. Palms should be soft and pliable. No loose threads or holes near fingers or on palm larger than a quarter.

NECKGUARD – must completely cover neck and fit snugly to avoid exposing neck and upper chest. Must have bmq certification and be free of fabric cuts. Velcro straps should not be worn and must be unaltered and in good working order. No tape should be wrapped around the neck guard and any tears should be sewn.



WELCOME MESSAGE FROM THE CITY OF COQUITLAM



Welcome to the Poirier Sport & Leisure Complex! We are happy to welcome you and your team to our facility for the duration of your competition. We have a few notes we would like to pass on to ensure that everything goes smoothly:

- 1) **Balls and Pucks** – Please do not shoot, pass or stick handle balls or pucks in the hallways, walking track, lobby areas or change rooms. These actions can be a safety hazard for other users and may cause damage to the facility.
- 2) **Warm-ups** – As a courtesy to all other patrons in the building and our immediate neighbors in the Poirier area, we kindly ask that team warm-ups be localized to dressing rooms, an appropriate location off-site, or within bookable spaces in our building. Please reach out to bookings@coquitlam.ca with direct enquiries for bookable spaces. If warming-up off site, please be considerate with regards to music/volume, especially early in the morning.
- 3) **Signage/Posters** – Signage and Posters may not be posted/taped anywhere on the facility walls. The City can provide white boards or access to snap boards if signage/posters are required.
- 4) **Dressing Rooms** – Should be left in the condition they were in when you arrived. Any significant messes requiring clean-up could be billed back to you. Our staff members do their best to get in the rooms between groups to clean and tidy but this is not always possible. Please let us know immediately if there is a mess in the room or if the garbage or recycling bins need to be changed.
- 5) **Facility Parking Maps** - Poirier area parking maps have provided to the event organizer with team bus pick/up drop-off areas identified.
- 6) **Please let us know** – We want to help provide the best possible experience for your team while you're competing at our facility. Please let us know if any equipment repairs or clean ups are needed in the facility.

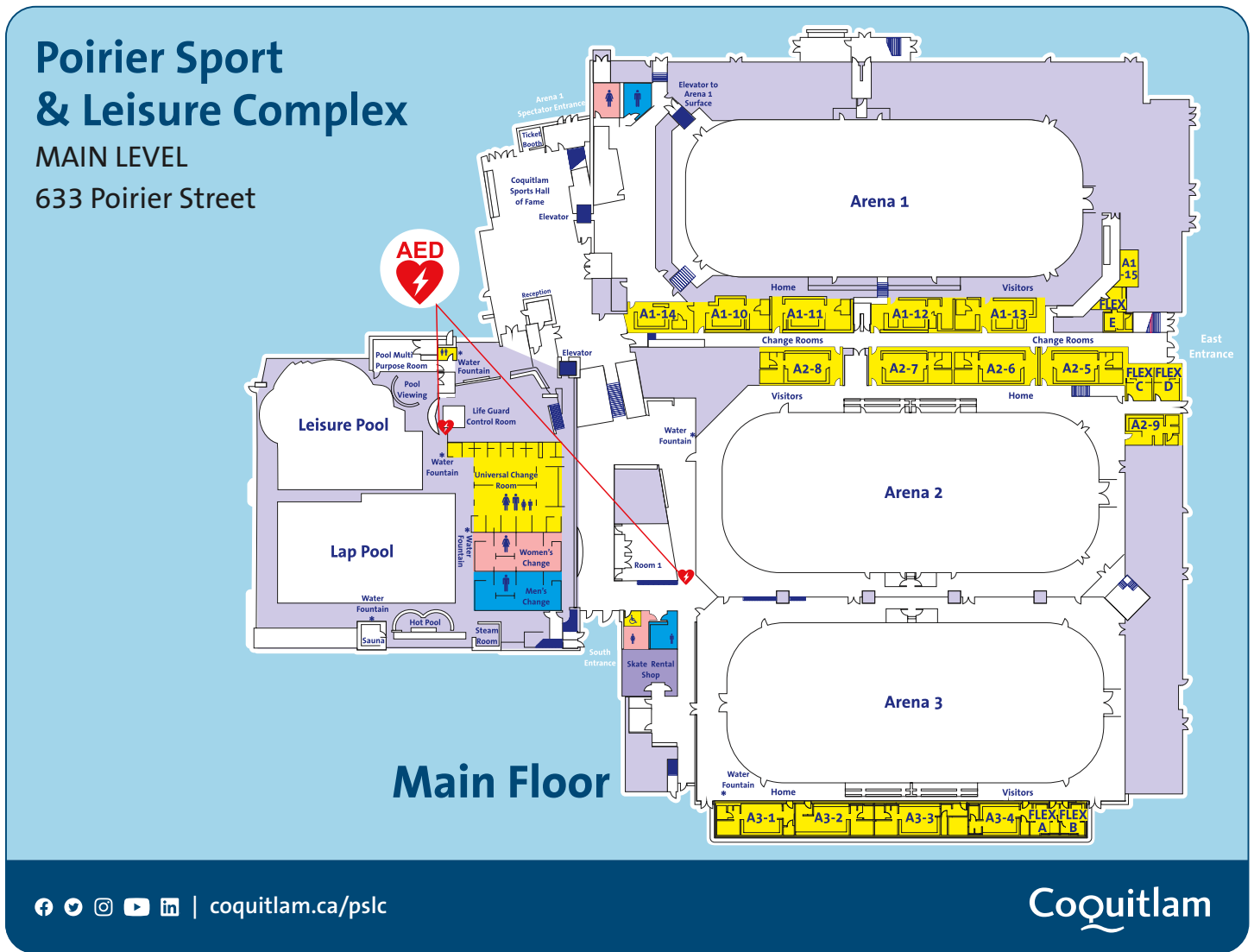

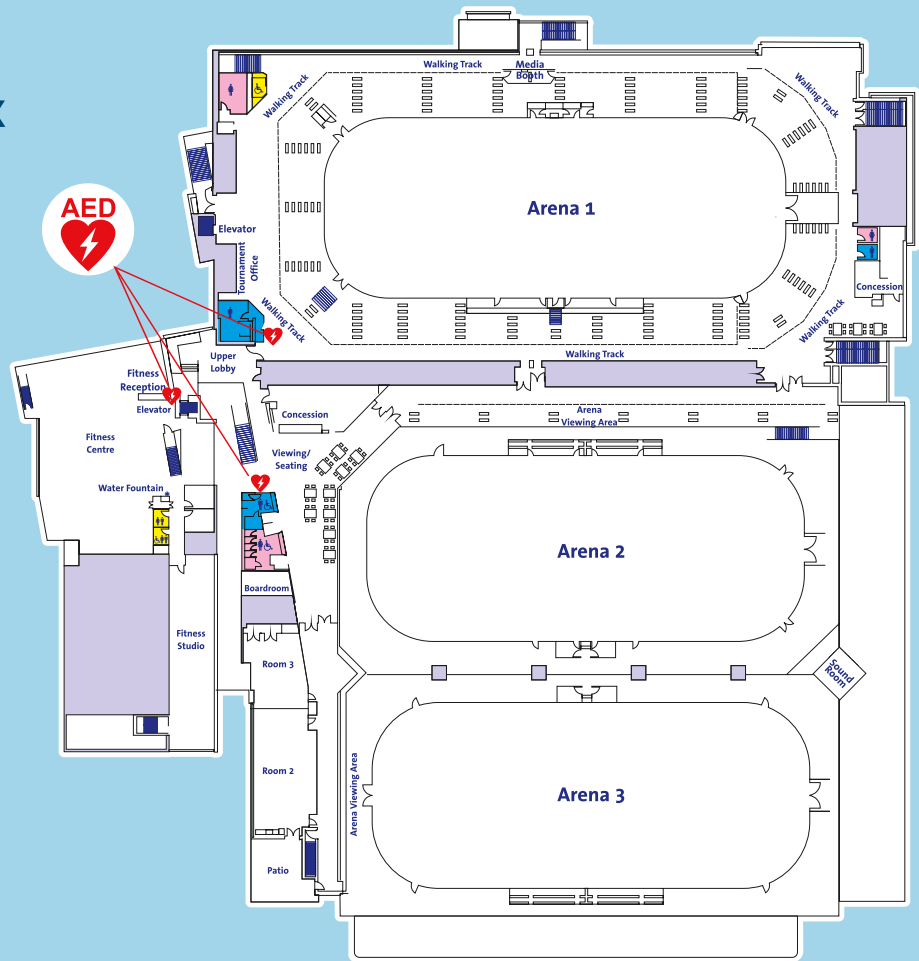

WHAT TO DO IN COQUITLAM

Coquitlam boasts a number of wonderful recreational facilities, endless parks and trails to explore, and a vibrant urban scene. Whether you're an outdoor enthusiast, a shopping lover, or someone who enjoys exploring the city's cultural attractions, Coquitlam has something for everyone.

RECREATIONAL CENTRES

City Centre Aquatic Complex | 1210 Pinetree Way

This complex contains a wave pool featuring a lazy river, interactive water features and a water slide, together with an 8 lane Olympic length pool, whirlpool, sauna, steam room and fitness facility.

Poirier Sport & Leisure Complex | 633 Poirier Street

This facility features three arenas, six lane lap pool, leisure pool, steam room and sauna, indoor fitness track, fitness facility and drop-in classes.



PARKS & TRAILS IN COQUITLAM

Coquitlam's trail system, one of our most requested recreation facilities, totals over 134 kilometers. It also includes a portion of the Trans Canada Trail, which spans from coast to coast.

Town Centre Park | 1299 Pinetree Way

This sprawling green space is home to the picturesque Lafarge Lake with a surrounding accessible walking trail, playground, sand volleyball courts, skate park, sports court, tennis courts, free outdoor table tennis and foosball tables.

Mundy Park | 641 Hillcrest Street

(24 hour off leash dog walking trail accessible via the parking lot located at Mariner Way and Chilko Drive – please review maps on site for designated off off-leash areas. The entirety of the park is off-leash before 10:00 am every day)

This rainforest is a magical place and one of Coquitlam's most treasured urban forests. There are many trails throughout the park culminating in an extensive 16 km trail system. The Hillcrest Street entrance also contains a state-of-the-art playground.

Como Lake Park | 700 Gatensbury Street

This inner-city sanctuary contains lakeside benches, open grass areas, a walking trail and a playground.

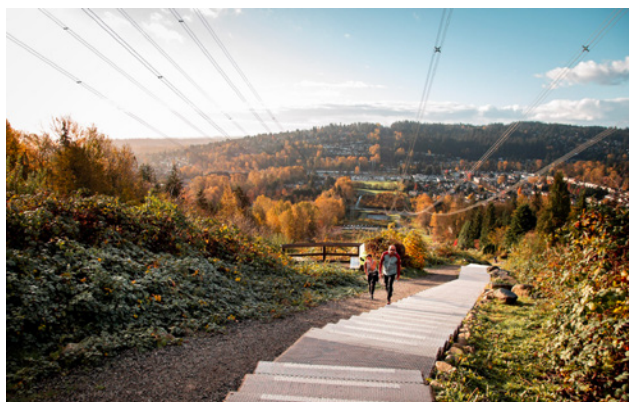


WHAT TO DO IN COQUITLAM

For those who love the outdoors, the city is home to stunning parks like Mundy Park, Lafarge Lake, and Minnehada Regional Park, offering hiking, biking, and scenic picnic spots. Coquitlam Centre provides a diverse mix of popular retailers, boutiques, and dining options.

WALKING TRAILS

Coquitlam boasts thousands of walking trails throughout magical forest. For fitness enthusiasts, a must see is the “**Coquitlam Crunch**”, a popular fitness challenge containing a 2.2 kilometer climb and two sets of stairs which provide a recreational fitness circuit. Hikers and fitness walkers can enjoy the natural setting and spectacular views of the City. The Crunch can be accessed from Eagle Ridge Park, Guildford Way, Lansdowne Drive, David Avenue and Bramble Park at Panorama Drive.

British Columbia’s largest shopping centre, Metropolis at Metrotown is home to over 330 stores and services.

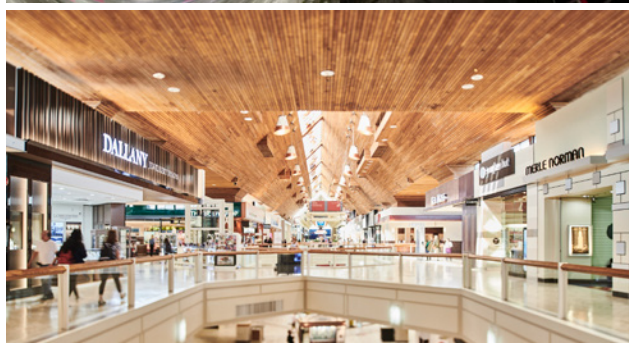

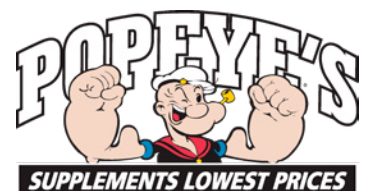

Rink 1 – is the northern most of three rinks in the complex and accessed through the main entrance located on the northeast corner of the complex off the northern parking lot. There are emergency exits along the north side of the building.

Rink 2 – is to the directly south of rink 1 and accessed through the main entrance located on the northeast corner of the complex off the northern parking lot. There are emergency exits along the south side of the building.

Rink 3 – is the most southern sheet of ice and accessed through the main entrance located on the northeast corner of the complex off the northern parking lot. There are emergency exits along the south side of the building.

Location of Landline Telephones:

Emergency Phone available in each of the timekeeper boxes, or at the front desk, located just inside the northwest entrance to the facility.

AEDs are located in waiting area between rinks 2 and 3, as well as in the second floor cafeteria, at the top of the stairs from the main lobby, beside the relish. * See map on page 10 and 11.

Lifeguards may be available from the pool. Request Control person to reach out to front desk to arrange lifeguard to attend the scene

Ambulance Notes: Poirier St is a north-south running two-lane road. The complex is on the west side of Poirier Street just south of Foster Ave and shares a parking lot with a public library to the south.

Enter north parking lot off of Poirier Street (Como Lake Side), drive to the back of the rink and enter the facility through the Zamboni Bay Doors at the East end of the facility.
