- Sponsor Acknowledgements: All teams will be allowed to acknowledge their team logo on their team page in the digital Championship program.
- Each team will be responsible for submitting a raffle basket of up to \$200 in value, on day 1 of the tournament (no alcohol, please). Please forward your theme to the organizers so that we can ensure that there are no duplicates.
- Please inform us of any female players so that we can plan an alternative dressing room, and also of any dietary limitations for the banquet preparation.

BY CAR
